About the Conversation Symbol



The symbol in this kit was designed in 2018 to make it easier for people to identify opportunities to socialize with strangers. When worn as a pin (or placed on a table), it tells people that you are open to being approached for a conversation.


The project is based upon the idea that new social connections can be created anywhere, so long as opportunities are identified and activated. In order to make this process easier in an offline context, a simple, recognizable symbol was created to be easily copied and used in a wide variety of situations.

The third page of this kit includes a template for making your own 1" buttons. Many libraries, stationary shops, and other community spaces offer button making services, should you wish to make your own set. Enamel pins and buttons are also available for free (while supplies last) at Meet A Stranger gatherings in Victoria.
